



# BISTORY of the FESTIVAL



Fort Walton Beach's biggest Labor Day celebration in history was touched off when a two-masted schooner, escorted by a fleet of small boats, hove into sight in Santa Rosa Sound and a few minutes later, dumped its cargo of screaming pirates and wenches on the shore at Spin Drift Restaurant.

Nathan Fleet, as Bowlegs, headed the crew and was met at the water's edge by Mayor Thomas E. Brooks, who presented him with a large, gold-painted key to the City.

Mayor Brooks said (and we quote!) - "Captain Billy Bowlegs, your ladies and pirate crew or should I say, fellow pirates? As you can see by my sunken chest, I'm well-qualified to join your pirate band! As Mayor of Fort Walton Beach and on behalf of the Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce and residents of this area, it is my pleasure to present to you and your fellow pirates this key to the City with the hope that revelry, frivolity, fun and happiness will reign supreme until the dawn of Tuesday morn. Let there be no further delay. Be ye on your merry way" ..... Bowlegs and his motley crew led a parade down Main Street to the east end of Brooks Bridge where an estimated 8,000 people watched a two-hour water ski carnival. Later in the afternoon, Choctawhatchee Bowmen's Club staged an exhibition of archery skill at Community Center grounds. Saturday night, Bowlegs selected Miss Diane Sloat of Slidell, Louisiana, as his "Captive Queen" to reign over the Bowlegs Ball with him .... members of the pirate band opened a large treasure chest and tossed favors to the crowd." (excerpt from front page story, PLAYGROUND NEWS, Sept 8, 1955)

Starting with a ski show sponsored by the Fort Walton Beach City Recreation Dept to give the local residents and tourists something to enjoy over the Labor Day weekend in 1953, the event became so popular that the following year the Jaycees decided to follow a pirate theme and name it after the infamous pirate, Billy Bowlegs, whose base of operations was the area waters. The Festival finally grew into a week-long affair and was moved to officially "open" the beginning of the summer tourist season.

The Greater Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce's Attractions Committee (later a separate committee, the Billy Bowlegs Festival Committee), together with the Krewe of Bowlegs, a mystic order under charter rules and regulations conceived in 1956 around the idea of a Gasparilla-type observance, centered on a Billy Bowlegs' theme .... Bowlegs being a pirate of controversial authenticity whose alleged activities were widely spread through the Playground Area.

# ....and The Krewe

The 1957 Souvenir Program and Guide for the 4th Annual Billy Bowlegs Pirate Festival, sponsored by the JAYCEES, featured an article on the Billy Bowlegs Costume Ball. For those who love a bit of nostalgia, we quote:

"Everybody loves to dress up once in awhile .... dress up in something really unusual. That's why the Billy Bowlegs Costume Ball has been such a success through the years. Last year, so many folks attended the one costume ball that three have been planned for this year. The first annual Krewe of Bowlegs' Ball will be held Friday night at the Shalimar Club. This strictly invitational affair is sponsored by the Krewe of Bowlegs, a group of local business and professional men. Cap'n Billy will appear at the Krewe of Bowlegs Ball, still masked .... his true identity will not be revealed until the JAYCEE-sponsored Captive Queen Ball Saturday night .... to be held at Tower Beach Casino .... Johnny Long's Orchestra will play for dancing ..."

This 1957 Program lists 68 Krewe members with a 5-man Board of Directors. (The first Billy under organized and recognized jurisdiction was Roger Clary). The Krewe's present active membership is limited to 165, plus members of the Society of Bowlegs, and is governed by a 13-man Board of Directors.

Visitors to and citizens of the area are usually in for many days of unprecedented fun and frolic during the celebration and the spotlight of pomp and ceremony focused on the Krewe's participation. Hours of volunteered time and sizeable sums of money (all Krewe events are paid for from Krewe annual membership dues) are expended each year on colorful floats, impressive decorations and gaily colored costumes used by the Krewe during the Grand Torchlight Parade and at the Coronation Pageant and Balls. The beautiful floats, depicting each year's "theme", which the masked Krewe ride, allow the members to throw showers of souvenir trinkets and coins to the thousands lining the parade route. The last evening of each Festival Week, a Coronation Pageant (this open-to-the-public event was conceived by Jim Kendrick, Captain Billy Bowlegs XVI in 1971) discloses, with the unmasking of a new Captain Billy Bowlegs, his Queen, First Mate, Honor Guard and the Children of the Court. The "Billy" is selected by secret ballot early each year - he, in turn, chooses his Queen and Court.

A complete history of the Krewe, like the history of piracy itself, would fill many volumes ... pirates have always been with us in one form or another from the prehistoric sea rovers of the Bronze Age to the present-day river pirates of some East Asian ports .... but we like to think that the KREWE OF BOWLEGS is unique among pirate bands!

The Krewe wishes you, one and all, a wonderful evening as we celebrate our SILVER ANNIVERSARY .... we hope you will all be "on board" once again next year when we can again be your hosts for the pageantry of the Bowlegs' Festival!

The BILLY BOWLEGS' FESTIVAL has William Augustus Bowles, a notorious old boy, as its patron pirate. He arrived in what was to become Florida's Playground Area in 1778 when the Spanish. English and Americans were maneuvering for control of the Gulf shores and its shipping lanes. Believing himself destined to command instead of obeying, Captain Billy Bowlegs gathered a force of a "couple hundred plundering Indians, relics from the American Army and white banditti".... a rolicking piratical crew which grew to be the concern of all three of the power-hungry countries. Captain Bowlegs (Bowles) created his own throne and the three nations considered everything from murder to a general's commission to get him on the right side. Financed by loot from a Spanish ship and surrounded by a handful of Indians, Captain Billy invaded English society for support. He was rewarded with a flag of "English and Indian colors mixed", a silver pipe, a tomahawk, a chain of friendship and trade supplies with which, he formed the State of Muskogee. The Spanish enticed him to New Orleans and there grabbed the new head of state. He was then shipped out to Madrid, Spain, and then to the Philippines, but he jumped ship and returned to his "state" and greater deeds of piracy. He raided on the Gulf and on its shores. His schooners flew his pirate flag except when they switched to the British flag to claim their "salvaged" loot at international ports.

..... But all "good" pirates must have an end; and Captain Bowlegs' came after he was lured to peace talks in the presence of Spanish, American and British agents where he was seized. The Spanish paid their disenchanted Indians a reward and took poor ol' Cap'n Bowlegs to Morro Castle. There, in 1803, he starved himself to death rather than to "sink so low as to speak to the Cuban general"!




