History of the Festival

Walton Beach City Recreation Dept to give the local residents and tourists something to enjoy over the Labor Day weekend in 1953, the event became so popular that the following year the Jaycees decided to follow a "pirate" theme and name it after the infamous pirate, Billy Bowlegs -- Bowlegs being a pirate of controversial authenticity whose alleged dastardly activities were widely spread throughout the Playground Area

"Beards were grown and soon the townspeople began to get the festival fever. Sewing shops were swamped with orders for exotic costumes and mothers and wives spent their days designing and making "pirate" garb. The local yacht club was the scene of feverish activity. Thousands of local people and visitors alike enjoyed the gaily decorated dance that night and went home vowing to return again next year"... a few of the Jaycees who worked day and night to insure its success were Bob Markham, Jim Kendrick, Basil Boles, Harry Buchanan, Jerry Melvin ... Nathan Fleet was the first Billy Bowlegs. (In later years, his son, Judge Erwin Fleet, reigned as Billy Bowlegs XIV).

Due to the growing popularity of the Festival, the Jaycees decided to make a three-day affair of the event in 1956 and called on the City fathers to help ... they responded whole-heartedly and over \$2800.00 was raised in one night! Events were added such as, treasure hunts for the children, parades, bigger and more elaborate pirate landing, burning of the Fort, plus a gigantic fireworks display - beards were again grown, the town gaily decorated and the first three-day festival began. The Jaycees at this time numbered 30 members: Roger Clary was Billy Bowlegs this year - the first Billy to reign under organized and recognized jurisdiction).

The Greater Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce Attractions Committee (later a separate committee, the Billy Bowlegs Festival Committee) together with the Krewe of Bowlegs, a mystic order under charter rules and regulations, conceived in that year of 1956 the Billy Bowlegs' theme. A 1957 program lists 68 Krewe members with a 5-man Board of Directors. The Krewe's present active membership is limited to 165, plus members of the Society of Bowlegs (made up of all active past-Captain Billy Bowlegs) and is governed by a 13-man Board.

Hours of volunteered time and sizeable sums of money (all Krewe events are paid for from Krewe annual membership dues) are expended each year on colorful floats, impressive decorations and gaily colored costumes used by the Krewe during the Grand Torchlight Parade and at the Coronation Pageant and balls. The beautiful floats which the masked Krewe ride, allow the members to throw showers of souvenir trinkets and coins to the thousands lining the parade route. The last evening of Festival Week, a Coronation Pageant discloses, with the unmasking of a new Captain Billy Bowlegs, his Queen, First Mate, Honor Guard and the Children of the Court. (Jim Kendrick, Captain Billy Bowlegs XVI, conceived this open-to-the-public event). The "Billy" is selected by secret ballot early each year - he, in turn, chooses his Queen, First Mate and Court.

.... and the Krewe

In keeping with our trip down memory lane, the theme chosen by Captain Billy Bowlegs XXVI is "THOSE MAGNIFICENT MEN AND THEIR FLY-ING MACHINES", bringing to you a pot pourri of song and dance popular during the years America's "ships of the air" came into their own - from Lindberg's lonely flight across the Atlantic to man's landing on the moon!

The 1957 Billy Bowlegs' Pirate Festival Souvenir Program included an advertisement which reads, in part ... "Air travel comes to the Playground Area. Within days, Southern Airways will inaugurate daily airline service to the Playground Area. Two round-trip flights to Altanta daily departing at 6:40 A.M. and 3:35 P.M. Both flights will connect with flights to every part of the country ... in addition to passenger service, Southern will provide air mail, air express and air parcel post and special charter service to groups who want to attend sporting events and conventions. Southern Airways has also selected the Playground Area to entertain the millionth passenger to fly the airline. The vacation for the lucky family will include complete accommodations, plus all entertainment facilities the Playground has to offer ..." The price for these flights with connections anywhere - only \$16.60, plus tax!

The famous Tokyo Raiders, lead by Jimmy Doolittle, brave men and true who first demonstrated to the Japanese in World War II that their island was not invulnerable (another milestone in the history of the fly-boy), trained in the Playground Area for this historic air mission - their 15th Anniversary was held here in 1956 at the old Shalimar Club and was hosted by radio and TV star, Arthur Godfrey. Special guests were the then Governor, LeRoy Collins, and Congressman Bob Sikes. With Eglin AFB, Hurlburt Field and near-by Pensacola Naval Air Station a vital part of our community, we are constantly reminded of "those magnificent men in their flying machines".

As the glittering anniversary reign of CAPTAIN BILLY BOWLEGS XXV and his Queen, Blanche, come to a close, we would like to remind those assembled here that a complete history of the Krewe, like the history of piracy itself, would fill many volumes ... pirates have always been with us in one form or another from the prehistoric sea rovers of the Bronze Age to the present day river pirates of some

East Asian ports or air pirates of the skies ... but we like to think that the KREWE OF BOWLEGS is unique among pirate bands!

The KREWE wishes you, one and all, a wonderful evening as we celebrate aboard FLIGHT #26 we hope you will all be "on board" once again next year when we can be your hosts for the pageantry of the BILLY BOWLEGS' FESTIVAL!

... Fasten your seatbelts and let the entertainment begin ...

The BILLY BOWLEGS' FESTIVAL has William Augustus Bowles, a notorious old boy, as its patron pirate. He arrived in what was to become Florida's Playground Area in 1778 when the Spanish, English and Americans were maneuvering for control of the Gulf shores and its shipping lanes. Believing himself destined to command instead of obeying orders, Capt'n Billy Bowlegs gathered a force of a "couple hundred plundering Indians, relics from the American Army and white banditti" a rolicking piratical crew which grew to be the concern of all three of the power-hungry countries. Capt'n Bowlegs (Bowles) created his own throne and the three nations considered everything from murder to a general's commission to get him on the right side. Financed by loot from a Spanish ship and surrounded by a handful of Indians, Capt'n Billy invaded English society for support. He was rewarded with a flag of "English and Indian colors mixed", a silver pipe, a tomahawk, a chain of friendship and trade supplies with which, he formed the State of Muskogee. The Spanish enticed him to New Orleans and there grabbed the new head of state. He was then shipped out to Madrid, Spain, and then to the Philippines, but he jumped ship and returned to his "state" and greater deeds of piracy. He raided on the Gulf and on its shores. His schooners flew his pirate flag except when they switched to the British flag to claim their "salvaged" loot at international ports..... but all "good" pirates must have an end; and Capt'n Bowlegs' came after he was lured to peace talks in the presence of Spanish, American and British agents where he was seized. The Spanish paid their disenchanted Indians a reward and took poor ol' Capt'n Bowlegs to Morro Castle. There, in 1803, he starved himself to death rather than to "sink so low as to speak to the Cuban general"!
