William Augustus Bowles

William Augustus Bowles, a notorious old boy, so legend goes, and patron pirate of the BILLY BOWLEGS FESTIVAL and the KREWE OF BOWLEGS, was born in 1763 on the Maryland frontier. At the age of 13, he joined the Loyalists Corps to fight against the American rebels. Two years later he was sent to Pensacola to join the British forces. He was commissioned an ensign in the British Navy at 16 years old. After the war, he rebelled against military life, insulted a British officer, and went into hiding with the Creek Indians (so the legend goes!). He married a tribeswoman, a chief's daughter, and in 1781 was welcomed back by the British to help battle the Spanish at Pensacola. During that time the British, Spanish, and Americans

were maneuvering for control of the Gulf shores and its shipping lanes. Believing himself destined to command instead of obeying orders, Bowles gathered a force of a "couple hundred plundering Indians, relics from the American Army, and white banditti."

This rollicking piratical crew grew to be the concern of all three of the power hungry countries. Captain Billy created his own throne and the three nations considered everything from murder to a general's commission to get him on the right side. Financed by loot from a Spanish ship and surrounded by a handful of Indians, Captain Billy invaded the British society for support. He was rewarded with a flag of "English and Indian colors mixed," a silver pipe, a tomahawk, a chain of friendship, and trade supplies with which he formed the State of Muskogee. He was eventually captured by the Spanish and shipped to Madrid, Spain. While being shipped to the Philippines, he jumped ship and returned to his "state" and greater deeds of piracy. However, all "good" pirates must have an end, and Captain Billy's came after he was lured to peace talks and there was betrayed by his Indian troops. The Spanish imprisoned him in Cuba in the infamous Morro Castle, and there on December 23, 1805, Captain Billy died.

Two centuries later the memory of William Augustus Bowles lives on in the annual Billy Bowlegs celebration.

To the Emerald Coast, Captain Billy left a heritage of pirate tales, great adventure, and buried treasure.


C. L. "Chuck" Ingram Captain Billy Bowlegs XLI

He has worked with Odyssey of the Mind programs in county schools and in state and regional capacities.

As a Krewe member since 1985, he has served on the Honor Guard for Ralph Fallin, Captain Billy Bowlegs XXXII, as a member, treasurer and vice-president of the board, and he and his wife served as First Mate and First Mistress for Captain Billy Bowlegs XXXVII, Johnny Johnson.

Chuck is married to Gerry G. Ingram, daughter of the late Martin Grimes and Acie Grimes of Destin. Gerry is city administrative manager and vice president for Compass Bank. She oversees branch operations for 6 Compass Bank offices in the Fort Walton Beach area. Gerry graduated from the University of Alabama in Birmingham with a B.S. degree in Business Administration, majoring in accounting and was a charter member of Beta Alpha Psi, Delta Chi Chapter. She received her Masters in Business Administration from the University of West Florida and plans to continue work on a Masters in Accounting to complete the requirements for C.P.A. licensing in Florida. She has served as past president of the local chapter of the Institute



The Ingrams have one daughter, Sydney Elizabeth-Ann, who serves as the train bearer for Queen Marie. Sydney has also served as crown bearer for Queen Ginny Glynn Barr and for Queen Jean P. Blumer. The Ingrams are members of St. Mary's Catholic Church.



Captain Billy's costume was made and designed by Karen Thornton of Mobile, Alabama. It is constructed of silver brocade and maroon slipper satin, trimmed in maroon and silver rhinestones and sequins. A Mississippi State University Bulldog imposed on the Bowlegs shield is the prominent feature of Captain Billy's cape. His wife's and daughter's initials adorn each side and in each lower corner is a magnolia, state flower of his home state, Mississippi.

Johnny has lived in the Fort Walton Beach area since 1956 and is a graduate of Choctawhatchee High School and Auburn University. He served in the U.S. Army as a Captain in Germany and Vietnam and was awarded the Bronze Star. He received a Masters in Business Administration from the University of West Florida and has a Certified Financial Planner Designation. Johnny has been in banking in Okaloosa County since 1972 and is currently the Senior Vice President, Commercial Loan Officer at Regions Bank. He is active in civic and charitable organizations in Okaloosa County and has served as president of the Niceville-Valparaiso Rotary Club, Okaloosa United Way, Okaloosa County Bankers Association, Fort Walton Beach Sertoma Club and Camp Walton School House. He is currently the moderator of the Fort Walton Beach Medical Center Board of Trustees and the President Elect of the Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce and serves on

the Hosts Council, Military Affairs Council and Bowlegs Festival Committee. Johnny and Marie are members of the Shalimar United Methodist Church, the Fort Walton Yacht Club, Shalimar Pointe Golf and Country Club, and the Okaloosa County Auburn Club.

The Queen's two-piece gown is made of silver brocade. The bodice and front of the skirt and hem are adorned with Swarovski crystal rhinestones, silver rhinestones, and pearls. The bodice is accented with rhinestone faceted drops. The scallop design collar is silk lace set with rhinestones and crystals.

The crystal crown of uniform height features a variety of symbols — palm trees, the words "Auburn" and "War Eagle," a dachshund, an apple, the number XLI, and her monogram.

Her 15-foot train, outlined in sequin braid and pearls depicts a Bowlegs crest in maroon and silver, a large midnight-blue satin and sequin War Eagle with a treasure chest in his claws, a sorority shield, a maroon dachshund, palm trees, and white satin scallops.

First Mate: First Mate Dr. Philip W. Blumer, a native of Kentucky, attended the University of Kentucky and Transylvania College and received a degree in veterinary medicine from Auburn University. He served in the U.S. Air Force from 1970-73 and was the base veterinarian at Eglin in 1971-72, before being transferred to the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology at Walter Reed Army Hospital, Washington, D.C.

Returning to this area permanently in 1973, he now owns Friendship Veterinary Clinic, an American Animal Hospital Association-certified hospital. 



Nicholas Gresham Foster



Krewe History

The 1957 Bowlegs Festival souvenir program lists the original Krewe membership of 75 men. Today, many Bowlegs members are second generation pirates, carrying on the tradition set forth by their pirate fathers. Roger Clary, Captain Billy Bowlegs II, served as the first Captain Billy under an organized charter.

As indicated by the Constitution & Bylaws, Krewe membership is limited to 170, plus the number of former Captain Billys. Each Captain Billy automatically becomes a member of the Society of Bowlegs, otherwise known affectionately as our SOBs.

Hours of talented volunteer time, plus sizeable sums of money are expended each year by Krewe members and their wives. Colorful floats, beautiful decorations, and numerous throws are utilized by the Krewe plus custom-made costumes are worn during the parades, pageant, and

coronation ball. The masked Krewe members shower the public each year with souvenir doubloons, beads, and the crowd favorite — cups. ALL KREWE EVENTS ARE PAID FOR FROM KREWE ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP DUES, NO OTHER FUNDING IS RECEIVED.

A new Captain Billy is selected each year from the Krewe membership by secret ballot. The past seven Billys are solely responsible for the secret nominations. Once the new Billy is selected, he chooses his Queen, First Mate & Mistress, ten Honor Guard men, and the Children of the Court. The identities of the entire court are kept secret until the elaborate Coronation Pageant.

The late Docie Bass, Captain Billy Bowlegs IV, was the first to select his Queen from the Krewe membership. Previously, the Queens were "captive wenches" and beauty contest winners. Past Queens belong to the Society of Queens, and perform many functions for the Krewe including the annual afternoon tea honoring the Ladies and Princesses of the Krewe of Bowlegs. After completing their junior year of high school, sons and daughters of Krewe members are presented at the Coronation Pageant. These young people serve the Court as Privateers and Princesses.

Periodically new events are added to the festival, and in 1989 the Friday night skirmish became a success. The Friday night and Saturday skirmishes take place between the City of Fort Walton Beach Militia (Walton Guard) and the Bowlegs Krewe. Armed with black powder cannons and muskets, the Militia perform a colorful and noisy defense when they engage the Krewe in battle on the Sound. These exciting family events, as well as the Monday night Torchlight Parade, are open to the public.

The Krewe of Bowlegs appreciates the participation and co-operation of the citizens of the Greater Fort Walton Beach area, and will continue to carry on the tradition of fun, pageantry and entertainment for people of all ages.




